“Painters of the LI’s North Fork” Set For Sunday, March 27

The Farmingdale-Bethpage Historical Society will conclude its 2011 Winter Lecture Series on Sunday, March 27, at 2 pm when Geoffrey K. Fleming presents "Painters of Long Island's North Fork". The program will be held in the Board Room of Farmingdale's historic Village Hall, 361 Main Street, Farmingdale.

Artists have lived and worked on the North Fork since the 18th century. The "Peconic colony" included such artists as Benjamin Fitz, Edward Bell, Irving Wiles, Henry and Edith Prellwitz, as well as others.

The speaker, Geoffrey Fleming, is the co-author of the widely acclaimed book, A SHARED AESTHETIC: PAINTERS OF LONG ISLAND'S NORTH FORK. As Amei Wallach concluded in her Foreword to the book, the landscapes and other paintings of these artists celebrate "a place, a history, and a way of living and making art." Learn about their paintings in this illustrated presentation which is free and open to the public.

“First Ladies” Program Attracts Overflow Crowd

The presentation by Elizabeth Kahn Kaplan of "America's Nine First Ladies From New York State" on Sunday, February 27 drew a "standing room only" crowd to Farmingdale's Village Hall. The attendance was estimated at about 140. At the program, which was co-sponsored by the New York Council for the Humanities and the Farmingdale-Bethpage Historical Society, the large number of attendees enjoyed the informative and entertaining presentation.

Deputy Mayor Pat Christiansen welcomed the throng to Village Hall and discussed the planned Veterans' Memorial Walkway project planned for the Village Green. The walkway area will include the Civil War Memorial provided by the FBHS. Dedication will be Memorial Day, Monday, May 30, 2011.

Jim McCullagh, Society Vice-President, presided at the meeting, at which FBHS Trustee Pierre Lehmueller introduced the speaker.

Trustee Eric Goldschrafe set up the Board Room for the program, and delivered an appeal for the Civil War Memorial Fund. Trustee and Hospitality Chair JoAnne Bihary was well prepared with a refreshment table amply stocked. She also conducted the drawing for the traditional Presidents' Week cherry pie, provided by Trustee Lehmueller and won by Elaine Ezzo, FBHS retired trustee, and a jar of Lincoln pennies, won by Elaine Boeggeman of Hicksville. FBHS member Bob Deignan once again assisted with the hospitality time.

In Memoriam: Dr. Philip J. Acinapuro

Dr. Philip Acinapuro, a longtime member of the Farmingdale-Bethpage Historical Society, passed away on February 27, 2011. He devoted 60 years of service to the Farmingdale Public Schools as an administrator and Board of Education trustee. In the community, he was an active member of the Farmingdale Rotary Club, a member of the Republic Airport Commission, and a leader in Farmingdale AARP. "Dr. A" as he was fondly known, also enjoyed the programs, day-trips, and dinners of this Society in the company of his wife Ellen and many friends.
